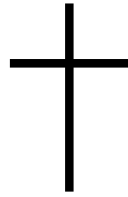

Epiphany

When God Goes Public

Dear Friends:

When most people today use the word epiphany, they mean a personal “aha” moment. I had an epiphany. Something finally made sense. Something clicked. But what the Church celebrates today is not *an* epiphany. It’s *the* Epiphany—and it wasn’t private, emotional, or subjective.

It was public.
Concrete.
Real.

Today, we celebrate the moment when God showed Himself to the world. The Magi—outsiders, foreigners, Gentiles—are drawn to Bethlehem, and what they see changes human history forever: not an idea, not a philosophy, not a moral code, but a person. God has a face. God has entered our world. Jesus Christ is real, present, and for everyone. That’s the heart of Epiphany.

Now here’s something many people miss: the Incarnation didn’t begin on Christmas. It began nine months earlier, when Mary said yes at the Annunciation. God entered human history quietly, humbly, almost invisibly. Like every human life, Jesus was hidden before He was revealed.

Christmas celebrates His birth. Epiphany celebrates His being shown—not just to Israel, but to the whole world. And that showing never stopped. From God’s point of view, the most important thing happening in the world for the last two thousand years isn’t politics, technology, or trending headlines. It’s this: Jesus Christ continues to enter real human lives—saving, healing, forgiving, and giving meaning where there was none. If that hasn’t been happening, then Christianity is just a nice story. But if it has been happening—and it has—then everything changes.

So how does God keep making Himself known? Through grace. Through the Holy Spirit. And—this is the uncomfortable part—through us.

Jesus didn’t ride into Jerusalem on a war horse. He chose a donkey. Ordinary. Unimpressive. Slow. Stubborn. That hasn’t changed. God still chooses imperfect people to carry Him into the world. People who mess up. People who doubt. People who don’t feel ready. People like us.

And how do we help make Christ visible today? Two ways: show and tell. Showing comes first. Jesus said it clearly: “This is how all will know that you are my disciples—if you have love for one another.” Not just being “nice.” Not surface-level kindness. But a love that costs something. A love that sacrifices. A love that forgives when it would be easier not to. That kind of love stands out. It feels different. It reveals something real. Telling comes next. Words matter—but they matter most when they match how we live. When someone asks, “Why do you live this way?” or “Why do you believe this?” our answer has weight because they’ve already seen something different.

At the end of every Mass, we’re told to go. Literally, “You are sent.” You don’t leave Mass empty-handed. You leave on mission. The Mass continues the Incarnation.

Your life continues the Epiphany.

So this week, let Christ be seen—through you.

FROM THE CATECHISM

CCC 528 — “The Epiphany is the manifestation of Jesus as Messiah of Israel, Son of God and Savior of the world. The great feast of Epiphany celebrates the adoration of Jesus by the Wise Men from the East, the Magi, who represent the pagan religions seeking salvation. In the Magi, the Church sees the first-fruits of the nations who welcome the good news of salvation through the Incarnation.”

CCC 439 — “The adoration of the Magi from the East shows that ‘the Gentiles seek him in order to find him,’ since ‘faith makes them sons of Abraham.’ The Magi’s coming to Jerusalem in order to pay homage to the king of the Jews shows that they seek in Israel, in the messianic light of the Star of David, the one who will be king of the nations. Their coming means that pagans can discover Jesus and worship Him as Son of God and Savior of the world only by turning toward the Jews and receiving from them the messianic promise as contained in the Old Testament.”

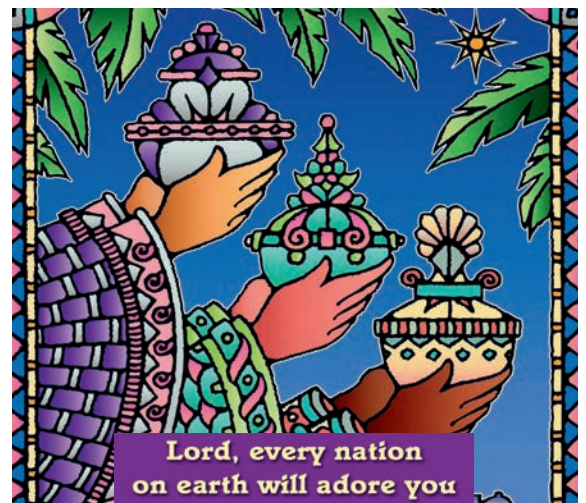
Rise up in splendor, Jerusalem! Your light has come,
