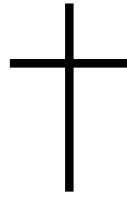

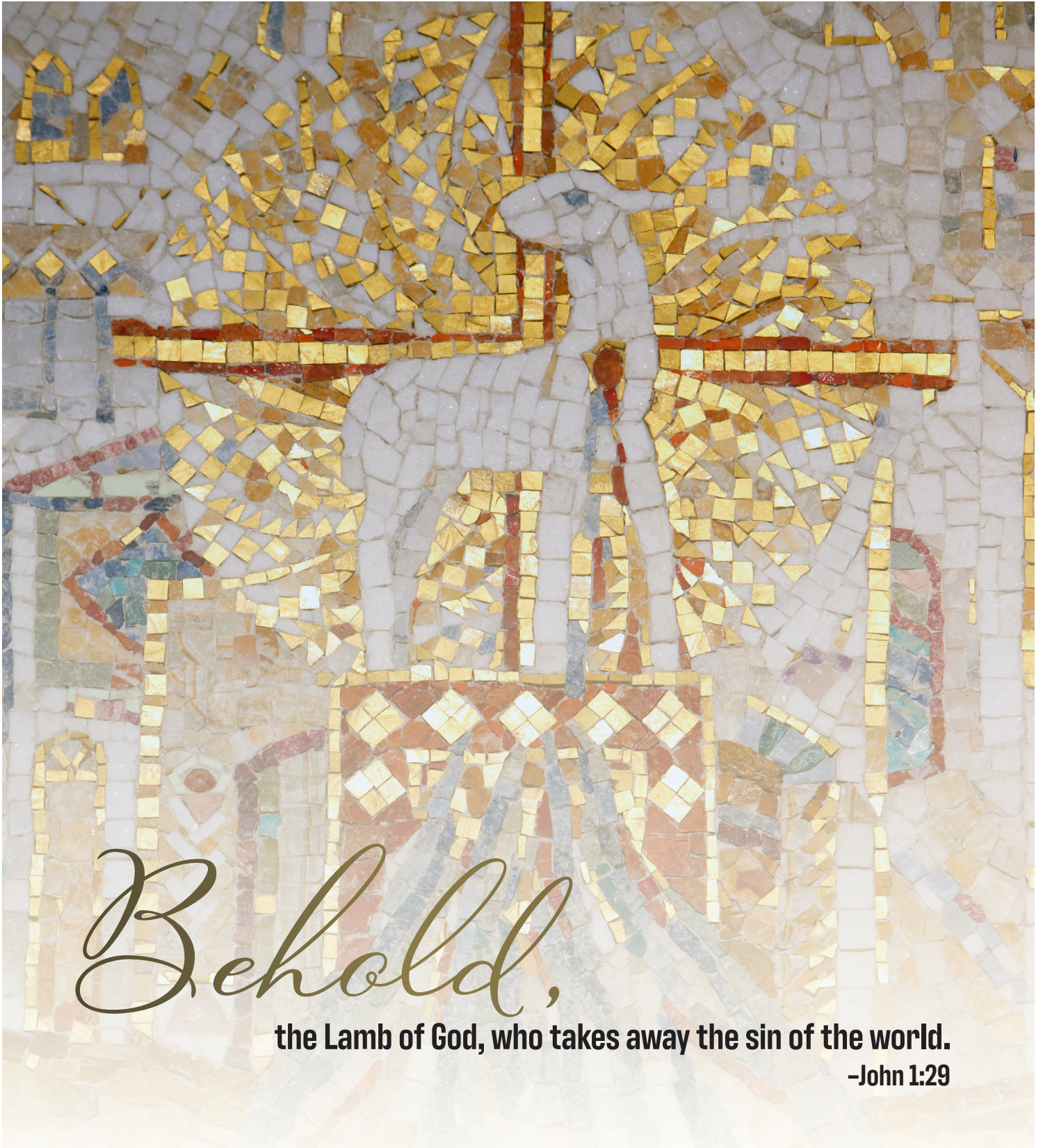

Welcome

No Middle Ground

Jesus is Lord!

Dear Friends:

The four Gospels were written by four very different men, for very different audiences. Matthew writes especially for Jews, Mark for Romans, Luke for Greeks, and John—uniquely—for the whole world. Their styles vary, their emphases differ, but they share a striking structure. All four center on Jesus. All clearly teach His divinity. All end with His Passion, death, and Resurrection. And all begin in the same way: by placing Jesus side-by-side with John the Baptist.

Why? Because John the Baptist was the last and greatest of the prophets. If Jesus were only another prophet—just one more holy voice in Israel's history—then John would stand above Him. But John himself refuses that role. In today's Gospel, John is crystal clear: "He ranks ahead of me... He existed before me... Behold, the Lamb of God."

John knows exactly what he is not.

John is not the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. John cannot remove sin. His baptism is real, but it is incomplete. In the Acts of the Apostles, Saint Paul meets people who were baptized only with John's baptism. Something is missing. When they are baptized in the name of Jesus, the Holy Spirit comes upon them. That difference matters.

When Jesus was baptized in the Jordan, the water did not change Him—He changed the water. By entering it, He gave water the power to cleanse sin. John could not do that. Why? Because John, holy as he was, was still a sinner like us, still a man like us. You cannot give what you do not have. Jesus gives us divine life because He is divine life. He gives us His Spirit in Baptism and His Body in the Eucharist. He does not merely point the way—He is the Way.

That forces a decision. Jesus does not leave us the option of calling Him simply a great teacher or inspiring prophet. A man who claims to be God either is God—or is deeply delusional. There is no safe middle ground. That is why Jesus once asked His apostles, "Who do you say that I am?" Peter answered, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." Jesus did not correct him. He confirmed him.

The earliest Christian creed was just three words: "Jesus is Lord." Not "Jesus is interesting." Not "Jesus is helpful." Lord. God.

If you find yourself unsure, you are not alone. John the Baptist admits, "I did not know Him" at first. Thomas doubted until he met the risen Christ and finally said the words that sum up the whole Christian faith: "My Lord and my God."

That word—my—is the real question. Jesus is Lord whether we believe it or not. But whether He is *my* Lord, trusted, followed, and worshiped—that is the decision each of us must make.

That word—my—is the real question for us, too, at Jesus the Good Shepherd & CCM. Jesus is Lord whether we acknowledge it or not. But whether He is *my* Lord—trusted, followed, worshiped—that is the decision each of us must make, here and now.

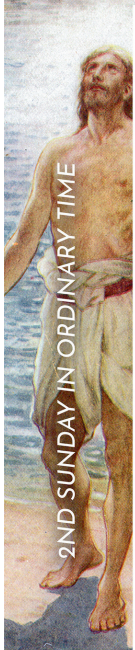
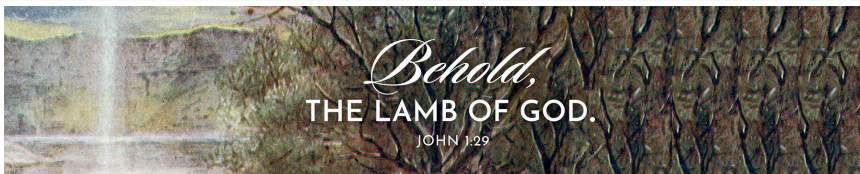
John the Baptist knew who he was—and who he was not. By pointing to Jesus, he teaches us that discipleship begins with clarity: Jesus is Lord, and our call is to follow Him in the ordinary moments of daily life.

- Reflect on who God is calling you to be—and who you are not.
- Point others to Christ through humility, service, and witness.
- Follow Jesus faithfully in the ordinary responsibilities of daily life.

FROM THE CATECHISM

CCC 608 — “After agreeing to baptize Him along with the sinners, John the Baptist looked at Jesus and pointed Him out as ‘the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world.’ By doing so, he reveals that Jesus is at the same time the Suffering Servant who silently allows Himself to be led to the slaughter and who bears the sin of the multitudes, and the Paschal Lamb, the symbol of Israel’s redemption at the first Passover. Christ’s whole life expresses His mission: ‘to serve, and to give His life as a ransom for many.’”

CCC 1225 — “In His Passover, Christ opened to all men the fountain of Baptism. He had already spoken of His Passion, which He was about to suffer in Jerusalem, as a ‘Baptism’ with which He had to be baptized. The blood and water that flowed from the pierced side of the crucified Jesus are types of Baptism and the Eucharist, the sacraments of new life. From then on, it is possible ‘to be born of water and the Spirit’ in order to enter the Kingdom of God.”



John the Baptist saw Jesus coming toward him and said, “Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world.

He is the one of whom I said, ‘A man is coming after me who ranks ahead of me because He existed before me.’

I did not know Him, but the reason why I came baptizing with water was that He might be made known to Israel.”

John testified further, saying, “I saw the Spirit come down like a dove from heaven and remain upon Him.

I did not know Him, but the One who sent me to baptize with water told me, ‘On whomever you see the Spirit come down and remain, He is the One who will baptize with the Holy Spirit.’ Now I have seen and testified that He is the Son of God.”

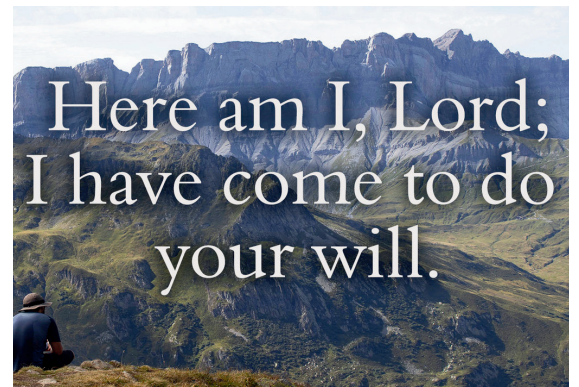

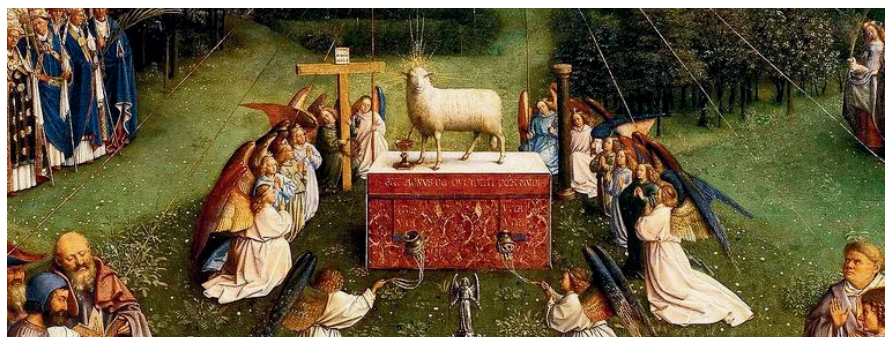
